



INSPIRE EXTENSION PROGRAMME

How are places for the Inspire Programme allocated?

"Talented students are those whose skills are distinctly above average in Literacy and Numeracy to a degree that places an individual at least among the top 10% of school results"

Each semester an Inspire Score is calculated for each student in years one to six. These scores are then used to determine which students will be selected for the Inspire classes.

How is this score calculated?

We have an extensive array of data for each child in the school, gathered over twelve months including a range of standardised, objective data, NAPLAN scores and school reports. This data is collated to create a data profile. For each assessment result, a point value is allocated. The points are then totalled for all assessments to give an overall score. It is this score that determines the rank allocated to each student. The Inspire scores are then ranked and the top 12 students in each year group are offered a place in the Inspire programme for one semester.

Parent permission is required before any student can commence the Inspire Programme.

Each semester the class lists are reviewed by Rebekah Melville and Julia Creasy with the classroom teachers.
